Clifford Ross is a photographer, video artist, and painter. In 2001, he fell in love with the sublime and magisterial presence of Mount Sopris in Carbondale, Colorado. In response, he invented and patented the R1 High Resolution Camera, a gigapixel imaging system capable of rendering the mountain's beauty in an unprecedented level of detail. The result is his recently completed "Mountain Series," a fourteen-image portrait of Mount Sopris in different aspects of weather and light as seen from four in the morning until nine at night every day during the course of a month in the summer of 2003.

Clifford Ross's work is in numerous public collections, including the Museum of Modern Art; the Getty Museum; the Metropolitan Museum of Art, and the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston.
